

EPBC Annual Compliance Report 2020/8676

2024

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1. Introduction

This annual compliance report has been prepared by Queensland Coking Coal Pty Ltd (QCC) to review compliance with the conditions of EPBC Approval 2020/8676 for the Vulcan Complex Project (the Project). The Project was originally approved on 9 March 2022, with a variation to the approval received from the Department of Climate Change, Energy, Environment and Water (DCCEW) on 22 July 2024. This report has been prepared in accordance with Condition 19 of the varied approval. Details of the EPBC approval are provided in **Section 2** below.

2. EPBC 2020/8676 Details

2.1 Entity to Whom the Approval is Granted

Queensland Coking Coal Pty Ltd (QCC) is the Approval Holder for the Project.

2.2 Approved Action

To construct and operate an open-cut coal mine, and associated infrastructure, located 35 kilometres south of Moranbah, Queensland as described in EPBC Act referral 2020/8676.

2.3 Controlling Provisions

Impacts to Listed Threatened Species and Communities as described in Section 18 and 18A have been approved.

2.4 Date of Decision and Period for which the Approval Has Effect

EPBC 2090/8676 was originally approved on 9 March 2022, and the variation was approved on 22 July 2024. The approval has effect until 31 December 2045.

2.5 Reporting Period

This report details the compliance with the conditions of the approval for a reporting period between 31 March 2023 and 28 April 2024.

3. Compliance Reporting Conditions

Condition 19 of EPBC Approval 2020/8676 states:

The Approval Holder must prepare a compliance report for each 12 month period following the date of commencement of the action, or otherwise in accordance with an annual date that has been agreed to in writing by the Minister. The approval holder must:

- a. publish each compliance report on the website within 60 business days following the relevant 12 month period;
- b. notify the department by email that a compliance report has been published on the website and provide the weblink for the compliance report within 5 business days of the date of publication;
- c. keep all compliance reports publicly available on the website until the approval expires;
- d. exclude or redact sensitive ecological data from compliance reports published on the website; and
- e. where any sensitive ecological data has been excluded from the version published, submit the full compliance report to the department within 5 business days of publication.

The conditions attached to the EPBC approval have been provided in **Table 1** below. A copy of EPBC 2020/8676 as currently in force has been provided as **Appendix A**..






